What Will I Do On The Job?

In the field of emergency service supervision and administration you may direct fire departments, fire investigation offices, and related services. You will supervise personnel who control and extinguish municipal fires, protect life and property, and conduct rescue efforts.

Administrators may supervise and participate in the inspection of properties to ensure that they are in compliance with applicable fire codes, ordinances, laws, regulations, and standards. You will also be required to write reports and complete paperwork.

What Skills Will I Use On The Job?

Develop your skills in decision making, management of people and facilitates, teaching and instruction, critical thinking, and complex problem solving.

Possible Job Titles:

Company Officer or Chief Officer positions with fire departments, emergency medical supervision, and fire brigade leaders.

Who Will Hire Me?
