Academic Documents

- ❑ Request official high school transcript, GED or HiSET scores. (May not be required for all TCAT programs, but required for financial aid.)
- ❑ Request official transcripts from all colleges you have attended.
- ❑ Submit ACT or SAT scores (if taken within the last 5 years) or take the college placement exam. These scores determine appropriate placement into college courses. Prior completion of college-level math and/or English transfer credit may waive all or parts of the placement testing requirement.

Proof of U.S. Citizenship/Permanent Residence

Chattanooga State is required to verify that anyone seeking in-state benefits such as in-state tuition or state-appropriated scholarships is a United States Citizen or otherwise lawfully present in the U.S.

- ❑ U.S. Citizens or Permanent Residents—Submit a valid, non-temporary Tennessee driver license or valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card or a valid, unexpired U.S. passport
- ❑ Non-TN residents—Submit a valid, unexpired state issued driver license from any state other than Tennessee along with a U.S. government issued certified birth certificate

Students who have had their lawful presence verified through the federal Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) are not required to submit additional documentation (e.g., J-1 and F-1 student visa holders).

Financial Aid

- 1 **Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at StudentAid.gov.**
- 2 **Apply for state aid by the posted deadlines.** *FAFSA required for all state financial aid.*
- 3 **Apply for institutional and outside aid.** *FAFSA may be required for institutional and outside financial aid.*

Foundation Scholarships are provided by the Chattanooga State Foundation and private donors. There are dozens of endowed and

named scholarships awarded each year. Requirements and award amounts vary. A complete list can be found at chattanoogastate.edu/scholarships.

The Chattanooga State scholarship application is available November 1 of each year for the upcoming year—priority deadline is March 1; however, scholarships not awarded by March 1 remain available until awarded.

- ▶ Use the tax year 2 years prior to the start of the aid year.
- ▶ Information about you or your parents' marital status, number in household, and number in college should be as of the date that you complete the FAFSA.
- ▶ Complete the FAFSA every year as soon as you can after October 1 of the preceding year for federal aid and most state aid.

Everyone who completes the FAFSA must have a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) and password in order to electronically sign the application—this is also your username and password. You can create and manage your FSA ID and password at StudentAid.gov.

You only have to create your FSA ID once, and it can be used to log back into the FAFSA, access your federal aid history, or complete federal loan requirements at StudentAid.gov.

 - Pay fees. Fees must be paid each semester to secure your schedule. If you do not pay by the posted deadline(s) then you will be removed from your classes. Students that receive financial aid, veterans' benefits, or other tuition assistance should verify eligibility each semester to ensure payment confirmation.
- 5 Complete the Following Prior to the First Day of Class**
 - Obtain a student identification card in the Student Life Department located in the Student Center.
 - Register for a parking permit at chattanoogaastate.edu/student-parking-decal-registration.
 - You can pick up your parking permit at the Bursar's Office in the Student Center, when available.
 - Purchase textbooks in the Chattanooga State Bookstore in the Student Center. Students with excess financial aid may be eligible to charge books at the Chattanooga State Bookstore before the beginning of each semester. Those students will have a notification on their Financial Aid Status page in TigerWeb.
- 6 Remember to Check Your Tiger Mail Frequently**
 - Important information and helpful reminders will be sent directly to your Tiger Mail. Tiger Mail can be accessed via a link in the upper right-hand corner of the TigerWeb home screen.
