Grade Point Average

- ACT composite score of 25*
- SAT score of 1130
- High School GPA of 3.50*
- GPA of 3.50 or higher based on a minimum of 12 hours of college level courses

*Candidates must meet all college-readiness benchmarks in math, reading, and writing.

As a part of the online application, you will submit an essay (250 word MINIMUM). The essay should be thoughtfully and carefully executed. There is no "right answer".

HONOR ACTIVITIES

The Chattanooga State Honors Program encourages students to be actively involved and engaged on campus. To meet this goal, students must attend at least three activities each semester.

Activities include:

- any event sponsored by the Honors Program
- academic and cultural events on campus
- volunteering at events to promote the Honors Program (such as open houses, orientations, and more).

The Director of the Honors Program will announce approved upcoming events via email. Students can request approval for additional events by emailing the Director.

Students attending Honors Program events will sign in to receive their points. Students attending other approved events on campus will email the Director with a thoughtful paragraph explaining what they learned at the event.

Points do not carry over from one semester to the next. If students do not meet their points requirement one semester, they must complete all required points plus one additional point the following semester in order to regain good standing.

MEMBERSHIP STATUS

The academic records of Honors students are reviewed after each semester. A scholar's status will be determined based on the criteria described in the table below. An active member of the Honors Program must be enrolled in AT LEAST ONE HONORS COURSE A SEMESTER (should their degree plan allow it), participate in at least three activities, and maintain the required grade point average.

For convenience, the honors program membership criteria have been summarized in the following table. However, interpretation and assignment of any individual member's status is at the sole discretion of the Director of the Chattanooga State Honors Program, where decision is final.

- 1-at the discretion of the Chattanooga State Honors Program Director, an Honor Studet's GPA calculation may exclude coursework completed at an early stage of the student's college career as long as the student has demonstrated subsequent substantial improvement in coursework preference
- 2-a one-semester lapse may be allowed as long as the student demonstrates a commitment to future
- 3-exceptions for good cause are available. Contact the Director of the Chattanooga State Honors Program for more information.
- **Good Standing.** The student is eligible for all Honors Program rights and benefits. This is the expected status of all members of the Program except for conditional new members.
- Conditional. The "condition" attached to this status generally is that the new
 member must earn at least a 3.50 semester GPA each semester in which they are
 enrolled until achieving a 3.50 cumulative GPA, at which point the student's status
 reverts back to Good Standing. If the student fails to meet the "condition", his/her
 status reverts to Probation. A conditional member is eligible for Honors Program
 activities.
- **Probation or Associate.** A member with probation or associate status is not eligible for scholarships. Probation members must achieve a minimum 3.25 cumulative GPA at the end of the semester following probation status or else be subject to dismissal from the program.
- **Dismissal.** A student failing to meet the minimum GPA, probation and/or student conduct requirements will be dismissed. Students dismissed for academic reasons may reapply at such point as they meet the criteria for admission.

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HONORS COURSEWORK



The Chattanooga State Honors Program is designed to meet the needs of high-achieving students seeking to improve their college transcripts and transferability with challenging coursework provided across a broad range of disciplines. Our courses will engage and challenge students inside and outside the classroom through small classes and close interactions with dedicated faculty.

In honors sections, the entire course is designed as honors instruction- from text selection to course scheduling to class assignments. *Discuss, writing, research, and presentations are hallmarks of honors courses.* Honors courses emphasize ideas and active learning over the lecture-only classroom.

The Chattanooga State Honors Program is committed to offering students challenging, engaging honors instruction that fosters active and collaborative scholarship, service, and leadership.

Our honors program courses have in common the following five National Collegiate Honors Council course objectives:

- To help students develop effective written communication skills
- To help students develop effective oral communication skills
- To help students develop their ability to analyze and synthesize a broad range of material
- To help students understand how scholars think about problems, formulate hypotheses, research those problems, and draw conclusions about them; and to help students understand how creative artists approach the creative process and product original work
- To help students become more independent and critical thinkers, demonstrating the ability to use knowledge and logic when discussing an issue or an idea, while considering the consequences of their ideas, for themselves, for others, and for society.
